


How to Install Wordpress.org

Step 1

Log in to your account and select the hosting plan then click Manage Hosting link

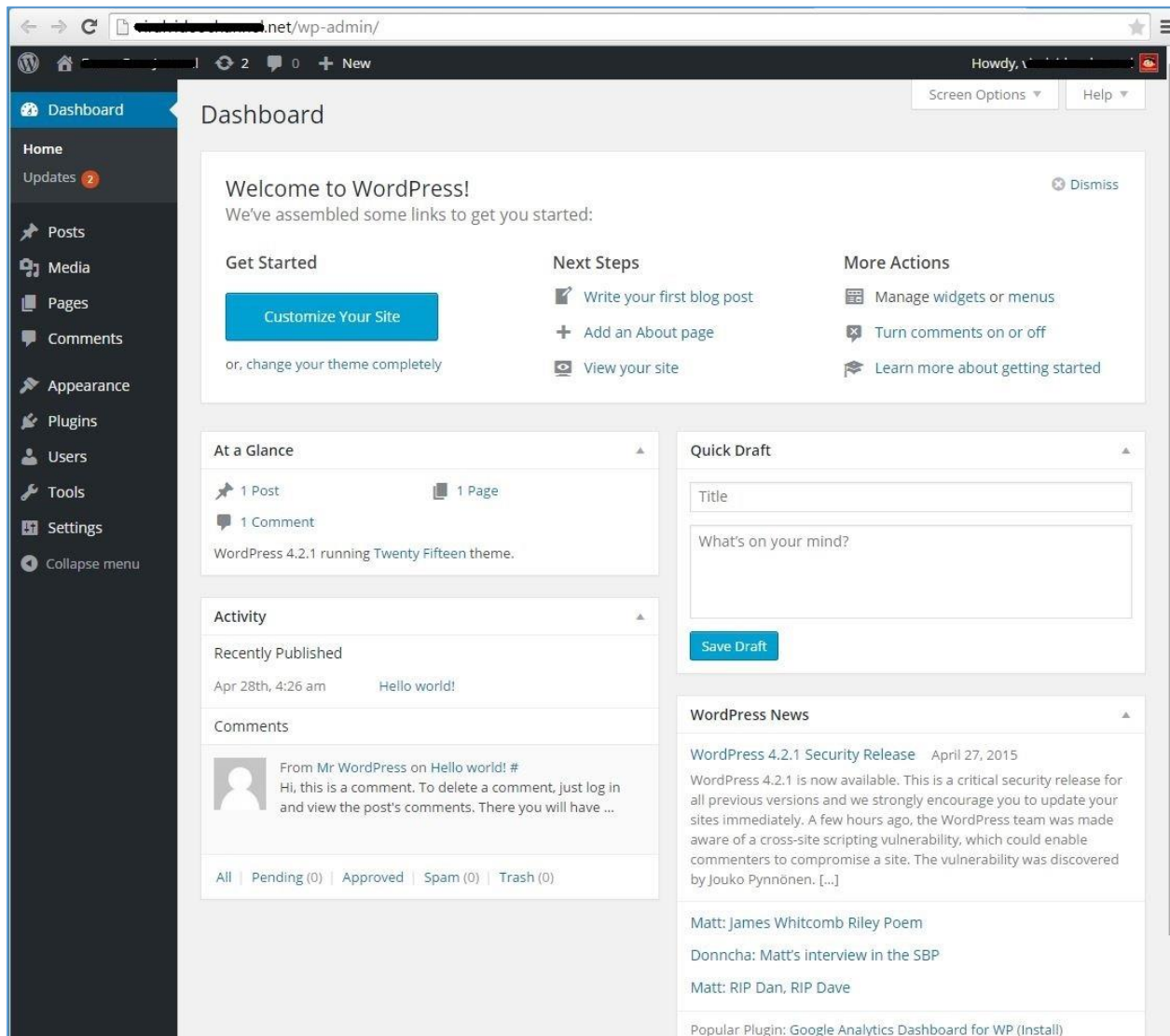
